Dear Concerned Citizen:



NOTICE OF A PUBLIC HEARING

A Design Public Hearing will be held by MassHighway in conjunction with the Division of Capital Asset Management and the City of Salem to discuss the proposed North Street Reconstruction project, in the vicinity of Bridge Street, in Salem, MA.

WHERE: Bentley School, Memorial Drive, Salem, MA 01970

WHEN: Thursday, May 31, 2007 @ 7:00 P.M.

PURPOSE: The purpose of this hearing is to provide the public with the opportunity to become fully acquainted with the proposed North Street Reconstruction project in the vicinity of Bridge Street. All views and comments made at the hearing will be reviewed and considered to the maximum extent possible.

PROPOSAL: The proposed project consists of changes to the intersection of North Street with Bridge Street, including reconfiguring ramp geometry and the installation of a traffic signal. This work is necessary to facilitate the construction of a new Judicial Center to be located on Federal Street.

A secure right-of-way is necessary for this project. Acquisitions in fee and permanent or temporary easements may be required. The Commonwealth of Massachusetts is responsible for acquiring all needed rights in private or public lands. MassHighway's policy concerning land acquisitions will be discussed at this hearing.

Written views received by MassHighway subsequent to the date of this notice and up to five (5) days prior to the date of the hearing shall be displayed for public inspection and copying at the time and date listed above. Plans will be on display one-half hour before the hearing begins, with an engineer in attendance to answer questions regarding this project. A project handout is available on the MassHighway website listed below.

Written statements and other exhibits in place of, or in addition to, oral statements made at the Public Hearing regarding the proposed undertaking are to be submitted to David Anderson, P.E., Acting Chief Engineer, Massachusetts Highway Department, 10 Park Plaza, Boston, MA 02116. Such submissions will also be accepted at the hearing. The final date of receipt of these statements and exhibits for inclusion in the public hearing transcript will be ten (10) days after this Public Hearing.

The community has declared that this facility is accessible to all in compliance with the ADA / Title II. Requests must be made at least 10 days prior to the date of the public hearing. ## **WHAT IS A PUBLIC HEARING?**

### **WHY A PUBLIC HEARING?**

To provide an assured method whereby the Commonwealth can furnish to the public information concerning the State's highway construction proposals, and to afford every interested resident of the area an opportunity to be heard on any proposed Federal Aid project. At the same time, the hearings afford the Commonwealth an additional opportunity to receive information from local sources which would be of value to the State in making its final decision as to which locations or design should be selected for further development.

### **WHY NOT A VOTE ON PROJECT PLANS?**

The hearings are not intended to be a popular referendum for the purpose of determining the design of a proposed improvement by a majority vote of those present. They do not relieve the duly constituted officials of The State Highway Department of the necessity for making decisions in State Highway matters for which they are charged with full responsibility.

### **WHAT DOES A PUBLIC HEARING ACCOMPLISH?**

It is designed to insure the opportunity for, and the availability of, a forum to provide factual information which is pertinent to the determination of the final location considered by the State to best serve the public interest, and on which improvement projects are proposed to be undertaken.

It is important that the people of the area express their views in regard to the proposal being presented, so that views can be properly recorded in the minutes of the meeting. These minutes will be carefully studied by the Massachusetts Highway Department and will be taken into consideration in the determination of the final location and design.

## **Changes to the Intersection of North Street Route 114 and Bridge Street Route 107 SALEM**

This Design Public Hearing is being held by MassHighway in conjunction with the Division of Capital Asset Management and the City of Salem to discuss changes to the proposed North Street Reconstruction project, in the vicinity of Bridge Street, in Salem, MA.

### *Background*

As part of the analysis for the proposed J. Michael Ruane Judicial Center on Federal Street, a detailed traffic evaluation of the area was undertaken. The Study Area included 21 intersections, links between the intersections, and surrounding projects.

### *Findings*

The removal of the easterly ramps between North Street and Bridge Street and the installation of a fully actuated traffic signals - at the intersection of North Street and Federal Street and at the intersection of the East Ramps and Bridge Street - mitigates the removal of the east ramps and provides improvements to the study area. Within the 21 intersection study area, improvements will result at 9 locations, with the remaining locations remaining the same. This project does not degrade traffic flow or pedestrian safety at any of the 21 intersections.

The installation of the traffic signal at North Street and Federal Street will also include improved pedestrian features, crosswalks, ramps, pedestrian signals, and will result in enhanced pedestrian circulation through the area.

### *Objectives*


The objective of adding these traffic signals to the current North Street project currently under construction is to mitigate the removal of the easterly ramps which is required as a result of construction of the Proposed Judicial Center on Federal Street. The remainder of the North Street project will continue as proposed.

### *Right of Way*

No Right or Way or easements are required for these additions.

### *Maintenance of Traffic During Construction*

Vehicle and pedestrian traffic will be maintained through the project area during construction. Temporary lane closures or temporary relocations of pedestrian movements may be required during construction to facilitate certain construction activities. Efforts will be made to minimize any inconvenience to the public. Pedestrian and vehicular access to abutting properties will be maintained during construction.
